# **Careers Provider Access Procedure**

## Introduction

This procedure sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to the students at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer.  $\cdot$  to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses

## **Opportunities for Access**

A number of events, integrated into the school careers programme, will offer providers an opportunity to come into school to speak to Student's and/or their parent/carers.
